International Youth Forum Activity Series**

**In the PLACE – Youth Hands-on Workshop on Industrial Heritage  
The Youth Team Selection Guidelines**

## **1 、 Objective**

The "Asian Network of Industrial Heritage (ANIH) 2021– International Youth Forum Activity Series" program led by the Bureau of Cultural Heritage, Ministry of Culture, Taiwan, echoes the spirit of The International Committee for the Conservation of the Industrial Heritage (TICCIH) 2022 annual meeting theme "Industrial heritage Reloaded" by organizing "In this PLACE – Youth Hands-on Workshop on Industrial Heritage." The aim is to inspire youth to observe and experience historic meanings, current conservation status, possible difficulties, approaches to re-use, as well as the relationship between urban and countryside. The forum, lectures, study visits, and workshop serve to cultivate the capacities of young people towards "understanding, analysis, innovation, sustainability, integration" and proposing potentially innovative plans of action with regard to each case, field, or domain. Simultaneously, the workshop serves to encourage youths to keep abreast of issues concerning industrial heritage conservation for the purpose of nurturing them towards becoming vital practitioners in the Asian-global industrial heritage network.

## **2 、 Participants and Qualifications**

- (1) The teams of youths shall be composed of students from colleges and universities in Taiwan and abroad.
- (2) Each team needs to have a teacher who is an industrial heritage professional and can communicate and discuss in English as the team tutor.
- (3) The team composition is based on the principle of 4-6 people, and international student participation (at least one) is particularly encouraged.
- (4) The event will be conducted in English throughout. Please attach TOEIC, GEPT, TOEFL or IELTS test scores in English, or international conference presentation certificates (preferred but not required).

The workshop enrolls 20-30 participants in principle. The selected students will be subsidized by the program for accommodation, material costs, and transportation arrangements for group visits. The aforementioned subsidy conditions are based on the prerequisite that the students participate in the entire activity series in this program (including international forum, conference, workshop, workshop presentation and exhibition).

## **3 、 Events**

※ *The organizer reserves the right to make changes to the event program.*

The selected youth teams must participate in the following events throughout the whole program (Please see Appendix 1 for the details):

(1) Precursor events of the workshop

A. "IN THE PLACE-International Forum of Industrial Heritage: Glocalization"

It includes two themes of (A) the function or meaning of contemporary industrial heritage, and (B) the integration of industrial heritage and local studies. It will be conducted in the form of "discussion seminars" with international experts and scholars invited to share their knowledge on specialized subjects.

It will be conducted in the form of "practical experience exchange" with domestic and foreign experts and scholars invited to share their experiences.

(2) Workshop: "IN THE PLACE-Industrial Heritage Workshop for the Youth"

a. Installation: The youth teams shall complete the final revision of the workshop results by November 2021, based on the feedback from the workshop, in order to facilitate the installation of the exhibition in December 2021.

b. Opening: January to early March 2022.

## 4 、 Proposal Requirements

Each youth team who has signed up for the selection shall submit the proposal of a creative action plan based on the following requirements:

(1) Current status and issue analysis of an industrial heritage site

Please refer to the eleven categories (water conservancy, processing industry, forestry, construction and construction industry, paper industry, energy industry, agriculture, transportation industry, electric industry, manufacturing industry, mining) of the inventory on the ANIH website (<https://anlh.culture.tw/index/zh-tw/inventory>). Each team all choose one place from the above ANIH listed industrial heritage sites in Taiwan as the proposal case. Proposals shall correspond to the spirit of this program "In the PLACE", including historical context, site characteristics, issues, investigation, and analysis of the selected industrial site. The spirit of the project can refer to the below:

## (2) Connect with the World- "2030 Cultural Indicators"

With the practice of interdisciplinary integration of cultural heritage conservation becoming a global trend, current international preservation of cultural heritage places emphasize on the integration of biological and cultural diversity. In 2019, UNESCO released the "2030 Cultural Indicators," including four major dimensions and 22 indicators as follows:



Each youth team's proposal must include at least two of the cultural indicators of the "2030 Cultural Indicators" cited above.

(3) Reference for the outline of the proposal plan (please refer to Appendix 2.)

## **5 、 Subsidy**

(1) Course: Participation free of charge (lunch provided); students need to bring their laptops, paper, pen and stationery, etc.

(2) Accommodation subsidy: Teams will be subsidized for accommodation fees, subject to adjustment according to selection status.

(3) Public transportation: On the first day of registration, please arrive at the venue (the Cultural Heritage Park, Ministry of Culture, Taiwan) by yourself; study visit transportation will be arranged by the organizer; on the last day of the closing ceremony, group shuttle service connection to Taichung Railway Station or Taichung High-Speed Rail Station will be provided.

(4) Group insurance: Accident insurance for group activities will be provided by the organizer.

## **6 、 Instructions for Submission**

(1) Proposal submission form:

The proposal shall be submitted in one of the following three forms.

A. Poster: Each proposal shall be limited to 1 A0 (841mm X 1188mm) single-sided straight format, and submitted in PDF or JPG format.

B. Written plan: Each plan should be written within 10 pages in A4 size and submitted in PDF format.

C. Presentation slides: Each proposal is presented in PowerPoint or other presentation software, within 20 pages, in PDF format.

(2) Submit other documents

Please fill in Appendix 3 "Selection Application Form" and Appendix 4 "Personal Data Protection Declaration and Copyright Assignment Consent," and scan it into PDF or JPG format, and then submit it along with the proposal.

(3) Deadline

Please complete the submission between July 26 and September 3, 2021, by 12:00 PM (Taiwan time UTC+8). Late submissions will not be accepted.
